

In the last newsletter, we reported that on pistol range 1, one of the overhead poles was sagging badly and actually collapsed before **Paul Farrington**, **Paul Belanger**, and **Dick Wall** could begin attempting a repair. Once the dust settled the crew moved in and removed the debris.

The photos below show the repairs underway (now completed) led by **Mike Lombardy** and one of his crew.





November 1 - Rifle Range Repairs and Updates

- Removed all existing target support posts on the 100 yd and 50 yd lines
- Excavated and installed new corrugated pipe sleeves with 2 4" of stone for drainage
- Back filled the new sleeves
- Installed and leveled all new pressure treated target support posts
- Installed new blind support brackets
- Fabricated and installed new 100 yd cantilever steel target support frame, reused existing steel hanging bar
- Fabricated and installed new homasote target supports for the 100 yd and 50 yd locations
- Installed new pistol range steel target mounting saddles
- Installed new still target stand protection for 2x4's
- Repaired existing pistol range target rack

Check This Out!

ISC member Carlos Coutinho submitted this photo with the following description.

"I thought it would be fun to share one of the projects I've been working on under quarantine. Below is a photo of a gun holster I made from scratch."



"I first learned leather crafting in Seekonk Jr High School around 1983 from Ronald Yuknis. He was a shop teacher there. I still remember a lot of what he taught me. I did a few leather items here and there over the years but I've gotten pretty good in the past 3 or 4 years. This holster is for a Ruger New Vaquero that I use for Cowboy Action Shooting. It's made from 2 pieces of leather glued and sewn smooth sides out. The inside undyed piece is 6oz and the outside piece is 10oz for an overall thickness of about 1/4". This is a very stiff holster. The stitching is all by hand. I dyed the leather with an airbrush. The tooling I used was given to me by my friend Andrea. She gave me her father's old tools after he passed away. I'm partway into making the two matching belts and left hand holster. I have the outside leather cut and dyed I just have to glue and sew. There's still a lot of work to be done but it'll be a nice winter project."

"Also, I decided to make my own stitching pony from oak so the rest of the gun belt will be easier to sew. I made the stitching pony from scratch. Not 5 minutes ago I just finished an everyday carry belt using the same basic construction; two layer smooth sides out for a 1/4" overall thickness, hand sewn on my stitching pony."

"Attached are pictures of the sewing pony, the EDC belt I just finished and another picture of the western gun holster... this time the pistol has custom made stag grips."
